SNAP-Ed Receives \$55,000 Grant from Walmart State Giving Program

The Ohio SNAP-Ed program received a \$55,000 Grant from the Walmart Foundation to provide meals and groceries for two six-week Cooking Matters courses in 20 select Ohio counties. The program will provide 440 low-income adults with hands-on healthful cooking and nutrition education to empower families with the knowledge and skills to shop for and cook healthful meals on a limited budget.
